The Caldwell Exempted Village School District Board of Education is looking for a dedicated fiscal leader who will be student-centered, and committed to our financial stability. The new treasurer will replace our former treasurer.

In addition to providing fiscal leadership for all programs and operations, the board is seeking an individual who will serve as a model of professionalism and continue to grow the district's fiscal department. The Muskingum Valley Educational Service Center is partnering with the board on the search process.

The Caldwell Exempted Village School District treasurer is the district's chief financial officer. It is this leader's responsibility to collaborate with and advise board members on fiscal matters, execute policies and decisions made by the board, and operate the district efficiently, effectively, and economically. The district looks forward to finding a treasurer who will help create and seek funding for student opportunities in a small, rural district.

The Caldwell Exempted Village School District and Community

The Caldwell Exempted Village School District is the heart of the Caldwell community in southeast Ohio, serving the children, families, and communities of parts of Noble and Washington counties from two buildings - Caldwell High School and Caldwell Elementary/Middle School. The district, covering nearly 160 square miles, offers the advantage of a rural, small town lifestyle. Located in the beautiful hills of Appalachian Ohio, the area is known for its hunting, fishing, outdoor activities, antiquing, and villages full of charm, character, and history. The district has immediate access to Interstate 77, is approximately 20 minutes south of Interstate 70 and offers access to air travel through the cities of Columbus, Akron-Canton, and Cleveland in Ohio; Parkersburg and Charleston in West Virginia; and Pittsburgh in Pennsylvania. The Ohio River also provides our area with numerous recreational opportunities just 30 minutes south.

Approximately 850 students attend the district's two buildings and preschool classrooms. Our caring staff is comprised of highly qualified teachers, administrators and support staff who work hard to provide our students with an exceptional education. We understand that great schools are important to improve the quality of life for our students and community members.

Community partnerships are integral to the success we experience at Caldwell Exempted Village Schools. Our parents, grandparents, citizens, faith-based organizations and business and agency representatives display their Caldwell Redskins pride by offering scholarships, volunteer hours and other forms of support for our students and teachers. Our district also partners with local, state and national resources, like The Cleveland Browns Foundation, The Columbus Crew Foundation, Harvard University, Allwell Behavioral Services, and Noble County CARES, to offer opportunities that help our students achieve at the highest levels. At Caldwell Exempted Village Schools, our goal is to provide the best educational opportunities and experiences for the students of our community, using the resources we have available.

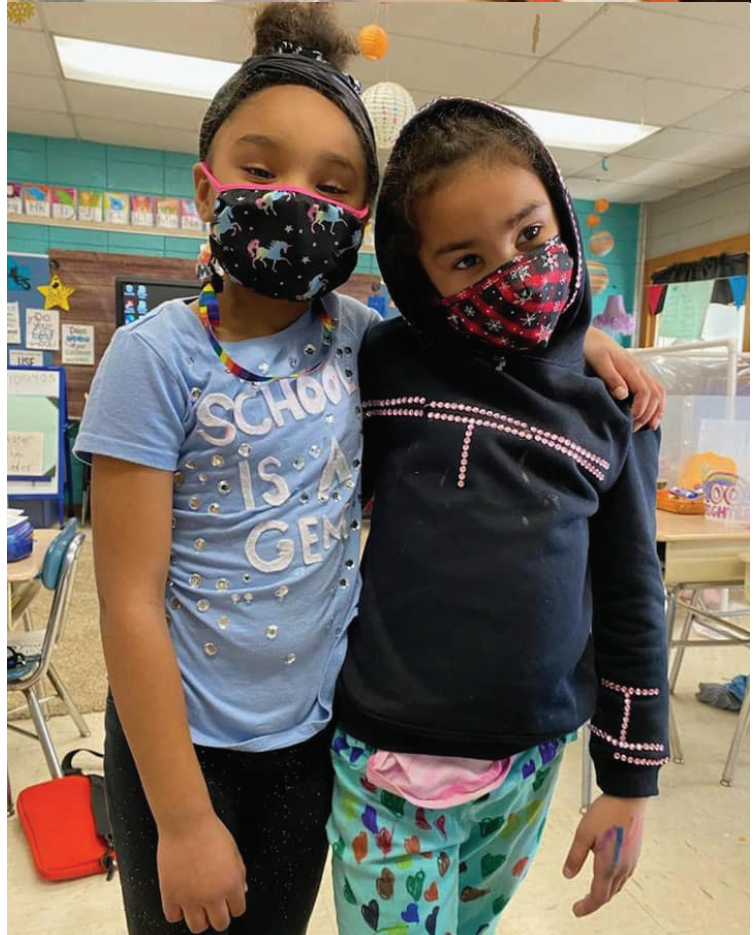
It is the vision of Caldwell Exempted Village Schools to empower all students with the knowledge and skills necessary to be college and career ready. We believe:

Thanks to partnerships with Zane State College and Washington State Community College, the high school offers 10 College Credit Plus (CCP) courses taught by our faculty on our campus. Students also have the opportunity to participate in the CCP programs on the college campuses. CCP greatly benefits our students and families because they will help cut the time students spend in college and the money parents will spend on their child's post-secondary education.

The district offers three Career Technical Education (CTE) pathways for students: Agriculture and Environmental Systems, Engineering and Manufacturing, and Art. Mid-East Career and Technology Centers also serves as an extension of our school district, providing career-preparatory program options for junior and senior students.
