

Drive to Succeed Round Three

Steps:

1. Go to the [MOV ESC Driving School page](#) to familiarize yourself with how our program works.
2. Next, use the image below to determine which ESC is responsible for your county of residence.



3. Select the appropriate ESC:
 - a. [North Central Ohio ESC](#)
 - b. [East Central Ohio ESC](#)
 - c. [Fairfield County ESC](#)
 - d. [Midwest Regional ESC](#)
4. Only apply when you have met all requirements, listed below:
 - a. Ohio Resident
 - b. Between ages 15 ½ - 20
 - c. Valid Ohio Temporary Permit
 - d. Proof of SNAP Eligibility within the past 12 months (SNAP card is not sufficient)
 - e. Completion of Parent Orientation Course on [OHID](#) under the Ohio Learn app (directions for creating an OHID and adding the Ohio Learn app below)
5. If approved, forward the approval to your school’s site coordinator (listed on the MOV ESC site) and stephen.michel@mvesc.org

IMPORTANT items to note:

1. You must select the MOV ESC Driving School as your preferred program location
2. Do not forget to forward the approval to your school’s site coordinator and stephen.michel@mvesc.org as this will help to assure timely enrollment in the program!

Get started with OHID

OHID is Ohio's digital identity. It is a shared service trusted by State of Ohio government agencies. With one OHID account, you can securely log into websites and applications from participating state agencies.

Every user must have their own OHID. To safeguard your information, you should never share your credentials.

Create your OHID account

1. Go to [OHID Create Account](#).
2. Enter your email address. Choose an email address you'll always be able to access.
3. Enter your email address again to confirm, and then select "Send PIN".
4. Check your email for a message from DONOTREPLY-Enterpriseldentity@ohio.gov that contains a one-time PIN.
5. Enter the one-time PIN from your email on the OHID website and select "Verify". Once confirmed, select "Next".
6. Enter your personal information, including name and date of birth. Then select "Next".
7. Create your OHID username, then select "Next".
8. Create your OHID password, confirm your password, then select "Next".
9. Enter your mobile phone number to help you reset your password in the future. Then select "Send PIN".
10. Check your mobile phone for a message with a PIN.
11. Enter the PIN into the OHID password recovery page, then select "Verify". Once confirmed, select "Next".
12. Review the terms and conditions, check the "I agree" box.
13. Select "Create Account".
14. If you see a success message, check your email for a message from DONOTREPLY-Enterpriseldentity@ohio.gov to confirm that your account has been created.
15. Success! Visit ohid.ohio.gov to log in.

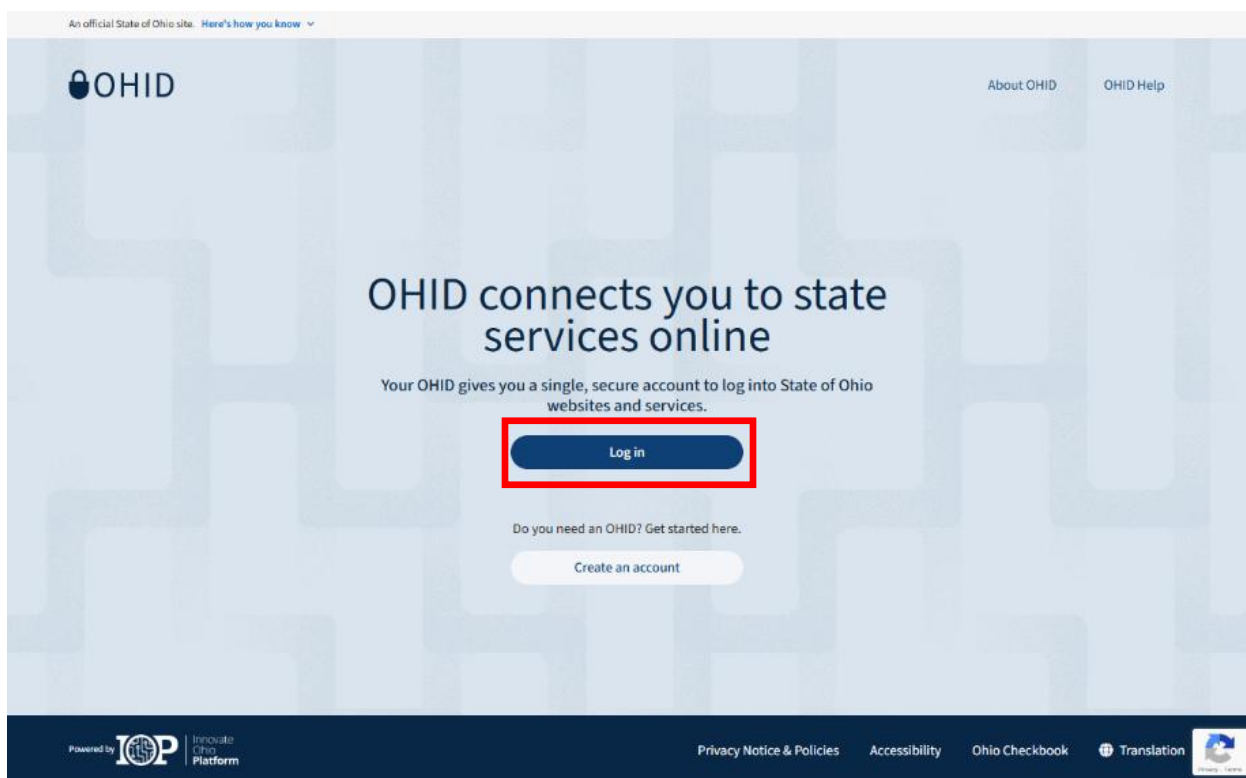

Creating a new OHID Account



Accessing the Citizen Portal using an existing OHID account

1. Navigate to <https://ohid.ohio.gov> and select the **Log in** button.

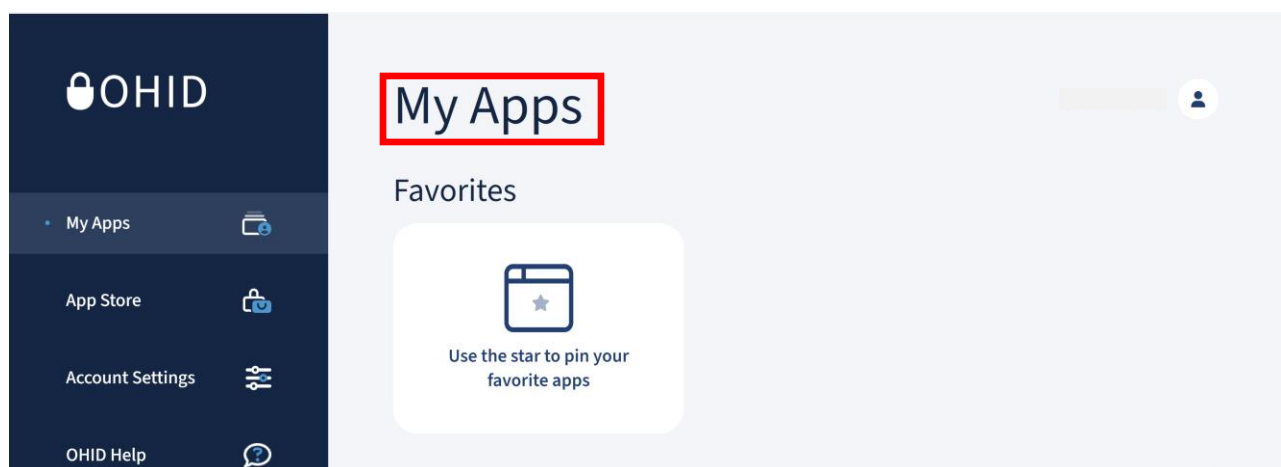


2. Enter your **OHID username** and **Password** and select the **Log in** button.



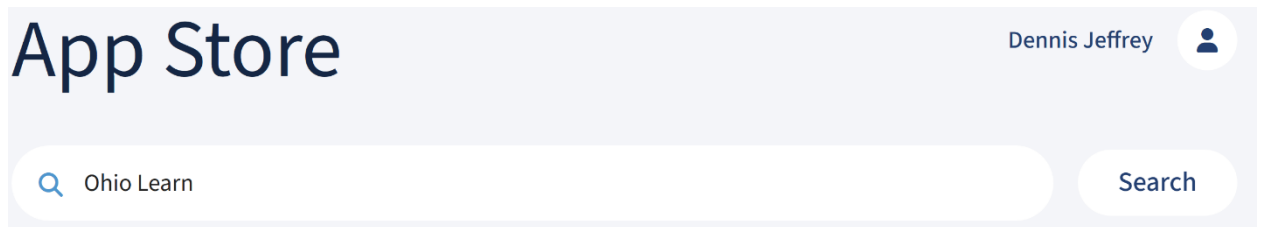

The first section of the OHID homepage is the My Apps section. This section displays tiles for applications that you have previously accessed. Note that dashboards may vary from screenshot shown.

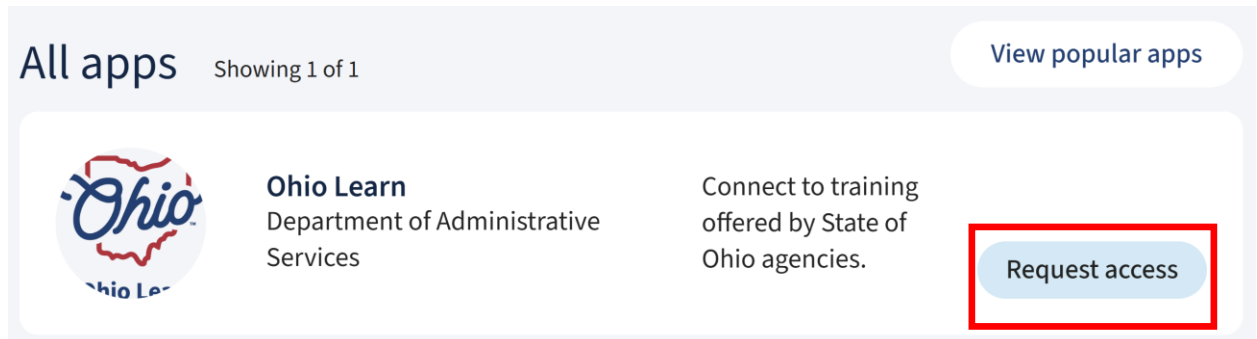


On the menu on the left side of the screen, there is a button for the App Store. This is where you can request access to applications that are available to you but that you have not yet requested.

3. Type "Ohio Learn" into the Search bar and then select Search.



4. The Ohio Learn tile will appear under All apps. Select the Request access button to add it to your apps.
